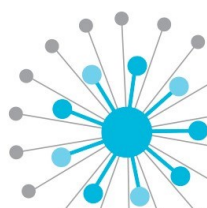
She has worked extensively within the NHS and statutory services in a broad spectrum of clinical areas in London and Cornwall and has a practical understanding of the recovery and rehabilitation process, from acute settings to community living.

Her work involves liaison with all key stakeholders including medical professionals, voluntary and adult social care services, solicitors, insurers, treating practitioners, carers and employers.

Joanna has extensive experience of hands on assessment and treatment, working with clients with varied medical, physical and psychological diagnosis and assisting clients with complex problems to reach their rehabilitation and treatment potential.

Joanna provides regular community brain injury OT rehabilitation to clients over 18 years of age in their return to functional performance and meaningful occupation, including work. This is often challenging in remote areas of Cornwall and Devon where employment is hard to access. Skills and knowledge of the surrounding area including voluntary and charitable organisations are key in helping to support these clients find meaningful occupation.

More recently Joanna has taken up a part-time voluntary position supporting teenagers at a local mental health hospital.

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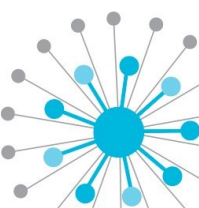

Clinical skills and experience

- Clients have included those with neurological conditions such as mild brain injury and post-concussion syndrome, stroke, Parkinson's disease, multiple sclerosis and Guillain Barre syndrome. They have also had a variety of orthopaedic conditions, including upper and lower limb and spinal cord injuries, brachial plexus lesions and amputations.
- Provided hand therapy for rheumatoid patients and carried out pulmonary and cardiac rehabilitation programmes.
- Interventions have included managing physical and psychological rehabilitation, delivery of post-concussion syndrome OT rehab programmes, assessment and advice on adaptations both at home and in the workplace, equipment recommendation and provision, the development and delivery of multi-disciplinary group interventions (such as pulmonary and cardiac rehabilitation) and monitoring graded return to work programmes.
- Works closely with consultants, general medical practitioners, health and social care professionals (nursing/physiotherapy/speech and language therapist/dietitians/podiatrists), social workers, case co-ordinators, psychologists and the voluntary sector.
- Training provision for health, adult social care employees and private home care on rehabilitation and goal setting, appropriate moving and handling of patients in the community, safe use of equipment and provision and managing risk.
- Management of own independent practice.
- Previous roles have included therapy team leader for the Early Intervention Service and team leader of a multi-disciplinary older adult specialist day hospital with 13 staff members.
